Rare Bird Brewpub is hosting a COVID-19 vaccination clinic for area restaurant, retail and hospitality workers. Monday's event continues the statewide "shots in arms" campaign partnership sponsored by Small Business Association of Michigan, Michigan Restaurant & Lodging Association, Protect Michigan Commission and local partners including Grand Traverse County Health Department, and Traverse City DDA. The goal of this campaign is to protect those in the hospitality industry who are on the frontlines of the service industry and interact heavily with the public, which may or may not be vaccinated. 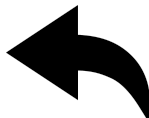
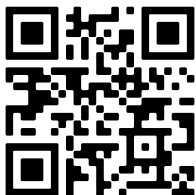
The first 200 restaurant, hospitality and retail workers from the Grand Traverse area who get a COVID-19 vaccination from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m., Monday, June 7, at the Rare Bird Brewpub, 229 Lake Ave. in Traverse City will receive a free \$50 Visa gift card from ??.

Key details to know about Monday's COVID-19 vaccination clinic in Traverse City include:

- No appointment needed.
- Walk-ins by individuals and families are welcome to get vaccinated, regardless of where they work. No one will be turned away from getting a shot if they request one.
- Johnson & Johnson and Pfizer shots are available.
- The first 200 will receive a \$50 Visa gift card.
- Proof of health insurance is not required.
- A parent or guardian must be present for ages 18 and under.
- The vaccines will be administered by the Grand Traverse County Health Department.

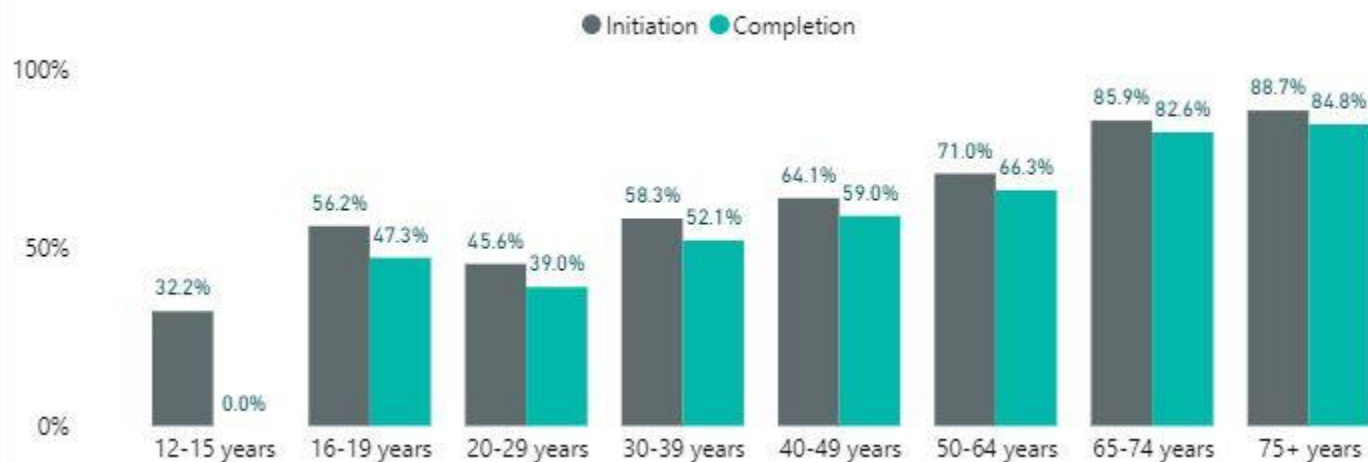
HOMEBOUND VACCINE HOTLINE IS LIVE: 231-995-6084

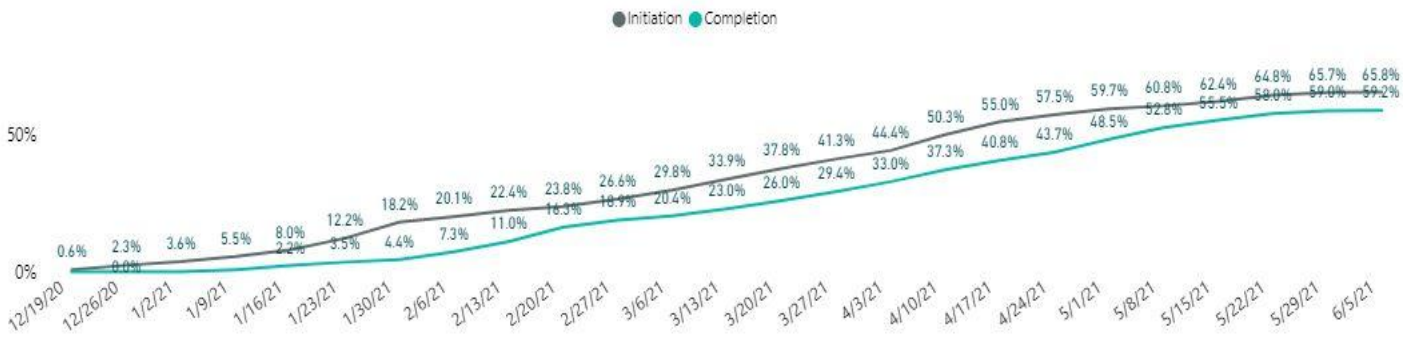
VACCINATION NUMBERS IN GRAND TRAVERSE COUNTY

Grand Traverse County and the Traverse City region continue to exceed the state average of vaccination rates of everyone eligible (anyone 12+). Our current total cumulative coverage is 65.8% for the initial dose and 59.2% for completed doses. CURRENT NUMBERS AND TRENDS

As the vaccination rates rise, average daily cases and positivity rates continue to drop. These are encouraging and hopeful signs that we are truly driving transmission down and the vaccine is working and protecting us from COVID infection and transmission. Daily cases continue to drop in the county and region. As of June 3, the 7-day average of new cases is at 4 per day, down from 6 last week. The 7-day average for percent positivity rose slightly to 4.7% this week. Both metrics have been declining for over 6 weeks. To see direct data, [visit our dashboard](#).

Some local trends of note currently are:

- 57% of cases in May were in those less than 40 years of age, those with the lowest vaccination rates
- Currently, there are 314 active COVID-19 cases in the county
- If you have cold-like, allergy-like, or sinus-like symptoms, please get tested.

TESTING AT CHERRY CAPITAL AIRPORT

Voluntary, free, rapid (antigen) COVID-19 testing is now available at Cherry Capital Airport for incoming travelers. The testing group will require proof of passenger travel on the day of testing (boarding pass or itinerary schedule). There is an approximate 30-minute timeline from registration to result. The registration and collection process takes 15 minutes, with results being emailed/texted to patients approximately 15 minutes after sample collection.

Below is their initial schedule, subject to change as flights activities shift heading into summer:

Sunday – 3:00 to 11:00 p.m.

Wednesday – 2:00 to 10:00 p.m.

Friday – 12:00 to 8:00 p.m.
