GTCHD CONTINUES TO OFFER *FREE* COVID-19 TESTING - APPOINTMENT NOW REQUIRED

The Grand Traverse County Health Department (GTCHD) continues to offer **FREE** COVID-19 testing availability at its main campus. Due to high demand, an appointment is now required to get a test. **To schedule an appointment, follow [this link](#).**

TESTING Hours for the week of August 16 - 20:

Monday - Wednesday from 9 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 1 - 4:00 p.m

Location: 2600 LaFranier Rd. Traverse City, MI, 49686

- Testing is available to anyone regardless of symptoms and is done on a drive-up basis only.
- **Due to the high demand for testing currently, testing is by appointment only.**
- Testing is done in your vehicle in the parking lot behind the main health department building.
- A doctor's order is not needed and there is no charge to be tested.
- Anyone that tests positive or is symptomatic will be offered a PCR (polymerase chain reaction) test following the rapid antigen test. Tests are for diagnostic purposes (this is not an antibody test).
- Results will be delivered electronically (email/text) within two hours.

CURRENT NUMBERS AND TRENDS

Grand Traverse County is reporting out on 82 newly identified cases over the last week. The 7-day case average is now 12 cases per day, compared to 3 cases per day one a month ago. As of Thursday, August 12, there are currently 232 active cases in the county.

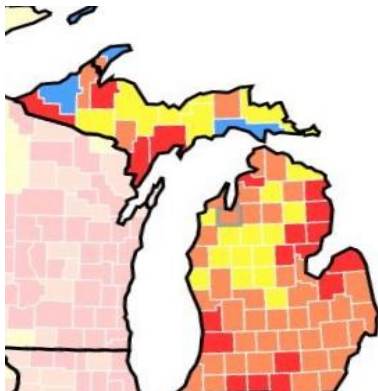

CDC RISK LEVEL MAP AND DATA

The map below displays data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as it pertains to community transmission levels. Note that the levels are assessed Mon - Fri. Use [this link](#) to see a detailed look at the data for each county.



According to the CDC, counties in red have a high level of community transmission, orange have a substantial level, yellow has a moderate level and blue have a low level.

Grand Traverse County is currently categorized as **ORANGE** and is considered to have substantial transmission. Numbers are assessed by the CDC and the map is updated accordingly.
