

GTCHD OFFERING THIRD COVID-19 DOSES TO SELECT IMMUNOCOMPROMISED

The Grand Traverse County Health Department (GTCHD) is now scheduling appointments for third doses of the Pfizer (12+) and Moderna (18+) COVID-19 vaccine for those considered “immunocompromised”. By [visiting this link](#), a list of those considered moderately to severely immunocompromised can be found. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends the third dose be administered at least 28 days after completing the initial two doses.

GTCHD encourages all individuals to consult with their primary care provider to ensure a third dose is recommended and discuss the risks and benefits. Third dose vaccination appointments can be made [here](#). (*Appointments for next week will be available on August 28, 2021)

GTCHD CONTINUES TO OFFER *FREE* COVID-19 TESTING - APPOINTMENT REQUIRED

The Grand Traverse County Health Department (GTCHD) continues to offer **FREE** COVID-19 testing availability at its main campus. Due to high demand, an appointment is now required to get a test. **To schedule an appointment, follow [this link](#).** (*Appointments for next week will be available on August 28, 2021)

TESTING Hours for the week of August 30 - September 3:

Monday and Wednesday from 9 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 1 - 4:00 p.m

Location: 2600 LaFranier Rd. Traverse City, MI, 49686

- Testing is available to anyone regardless of symptoms and is done on a drive-up basis only.
- **Due to the high demand for testing currently, testing is by appointment only.**
- Testing is done in your vehicle in the parking lot behind the main health department building.
- A doctor's order is not needed and there is no charge to be tested.
- Anyone that tests positive or is symptomatic will be offered a PCR (polymerase chain reaction) test following the rapid antigen test. Tests are for diagnostic purposes (this is not an antibody test).
- Results will be delivered electronically (email/text) within two hours.

CURRENT NUMBERS AND TRENDS

Grand Traverse County is reporting out on 124 newly identified cases over the last week. The 7-day case average is now 18 cases per day, compared to 12 cases per day the past few weeks. As of Thursday, August 26, there are currently 348 active cases in the county.
