GTCHD Highlights Back-to-School Immunization
August is National Immunization Month

The Grand Traverse County Health Department (GTCHD), in partnership with the Northern Michigan Public Health Alliance, is proud to recognize National Immunization Month this August. As families prepare for the back-to-school season, we want to highlight the critical role that vaccinations play in protecting our communities, especially our children, from preventable diseases.

As students return to classrooms, the importance of complying with the [recommended immunization schedule](#) becomes even more significant. Vaccinations are a safe and effective way to prevent the spread of infectious diseases such as whooping cough, chickenpox, and measles, which we continue to see each year despite their preventable nature.

“Childhood vaccination rates dropped locally and across the country as a result of the pandemic, but they are slowly increasing back to pre-pandemic levels,” said GTCHD Medical Director Najibah Rehman, MD, MPH. “However, there are children in our county that are under-vaccinated for vaccine-preventable diseases that limit us from reaching herd immunity for the general population. We do see cases like Pertussis and Chickenpox, so keeping up with the vaccination schedule is not only protective for your child, but it prevents outbreaks in families and social settings, like school, summer camp, etc.”

National Immunization Month serves as a reminder for parents and guardians to check their children's immunization records and schedule any necessary vaccinations before the school year begins. Staying up to date with immunizations is a vital step in safeguarding public health and ensuring that all children can learn and grow in a safe environment.
