STAY SAFE IN THE SUMMER HEAT

As temperatures rise, so does the risk of heat-related illness — especially for older adults. Our bodies become less efficient at regulating temperature as we age, making it more important than ever to take precautions during hot weather. To stay safe:

- Use air conditioning or spend time in air-conditioned public places.
- Drink water regularly, even if you're not thirsty.
- Wear light, loose-fitting clothing and avoid outdoor activity during peak heat (11 a.m.–4 p.m.).
- Watch for signs of heat exhaustion like dizziness, headache, or nausea.

Check in on neighbors, friends, and family — a quick call can make a big difference. Let's take care of ourselves and each other this summer.

NEED HELP COVERING PARKINSON'S-RELATED EXPENSES?

Parkinson's Network North offers a Financial Assistance Program to support individuals living with Parkinson's disease. Funding can help cover in-home care, adult day programs, short-term facility stays, medications, medical equipment, and more.

To qualify, applicants must have a confirmed Parkinson's diagnosis, live in the Grand Traverse region (or Northern Michigan and regularly attend PNN support groups), and demonstrate financial need. A completed application and physician confirmation must be submitted by September 1, 2025.
